The Parivartan project, a holistic rural development initiative launched by HDFC Bank, aims to foster integrated growth across rural communities in India. With a strong focus on sustainable livelihoods, natural resource management (NRM), education and skill development, health and hygiene, and financial literacy, this program seeks to empower communities to move from cycles of poverty to paths of self-reliance and growth.

Since 2017, CARD has been actively involved in implementing Parivartan, which began with just 8 villages and has now expanded to approximately 250 villages across five states: Punjab, Haryana, Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh, and Uttar Pradesh. Each intervention location is designed for a period of 3 to 4 years to maximize impact and sustainability.

During the reporting period of 2024–2025, CARD successfully concluded its interventions in Saharanpur (Uttar Pradesh) and Kinwat (Maharashtra), reaching a combined total of 7,361 households across 30 villages.

Ongoing interventions include:

- Mohla (Chhattisgarh): October 2023 September 2026 | 15 villages | 1,445 households
- Umaria (Madhya Pradesh): October 2024 December 2027 | 50 villages | 7,000 households (including direct and indirect)
- Madawara (Uttar Pradesh): April 2024 2027 | 40 villages | 780 households

These efforts represent a strategic, phased approach to development, ensuring tailored and localized support to each community.

Additionally, under special projects, we collaborated with MTMMCC Madan Mohan Malviya Hospital to provide specialized equipment such as CBC testing machines and washing machines. Aanganwadi children across six districts in Uttar Pradesh were provided with essential kits to support their early development and care.



Across multiple regions, various developmental activities are underway to promote sustainable agriculture, water conservation, and community empowerment. In Mohla, efforts focus on improving agricultural practices through farm bunding, contour trenches, and solar-based lift irrigation systems, enhancing water efficiency and preventing soil erosion. Renovating dug wells and installing micro-irrigation systems like sprinklers ensure better water availability, while the System of Millet Intensification boosts productivity and promotes indigenous grains. Organic composting is encouraged through vermi-bed installations to enhance soil fertility. Solar-powered drinking water solutions increase access to clean water, ensuring healthier living conditions. Additionally, value addition in millets and the establishment of a cluster facilitation center aim to strengthen millet-based enterprise development, fostering economic growth through processing and marketing initiatives. Oilseed and pulse cultivation diversify farm outputs, while nursery promotion enhances plant propagation. Vegetable cultivation using trellis techniques offers innovative ways to maximize space and improve yields.

In Kinwat, soil and water conservation is prioritized through pond excavation and structures like LBS and gully plugs to control erosion and rainwater runoff. Crop protection against wild animals is managed by demonstrating solar fencing, safeguarding farmers' produce. Deepening widening nalas improve water retention and enhance irrigation availability. Agricultural diversification is encouraged through watermelon cultivation improved vegetable farming techniques. Sprinkler demonstrations promote costeffective irrigation, enabling water conservation while maintaining optimal crop growth. Organic farming methods are emphasized in soybean and cultivation, with recommended practices and organic inputs enhancing sustainability reducing reliance on chemicals. Capacity building is crucial, with farmer training programs, financial literacy workshops, and support for small-scale businesses, especially for women self-help groups. Kisan Melava events facilitate knowledge sharing among farmers, while village volunteers support outreach. A documentary on the project disseminates learnings, inspiring further agricultural development.

In Madawara, various initiatives supporting farmers and the community are being implemented. These include exposure visits and adopting multi-layer vegetable farming and nano-orchard systems to optimize land use and increase plantation productivity. Tree efforts contribute to environmental conservation, soil health, and biodiversity. streetlights improve infrastructure and nighttime visibility, enhancing safety. An agricultural tool bank for renting tools eases the financial burden on farmers. Portable solar pump sets and sprinkler systems aid in efficient irrigation water conservation. and Organic demonstrations in cultivating pulses, mustard, and wheat emphasize sustainable farming practices. Training programs boost farmers' productivity skills. Soil bunding with stone outlets addresses erosion and aids in water conservation. Rejuvenating water resources is achieved through renovating dug wells, community ponds, and check dams. Additionally, constructing new check dams and gabion and Doha structures supports landscape restoration and water retention during dry seasons.

In Umaria, our focus is on initiatives that support both agricultural and community development. An agricultural tool bank or custom hiring bank is introduced to provide farmers with access to essential farming tools at a reduced cost. Cattle induction programs help farmers enhance their livelihoods through dairy farming, ensuring better nutrition and economic stability. Smart school development initiatives improve educational infrastructure, creating better learning environments for children. The renovation of Anganwadi centers ensures improved early childhood education and nutrition services. strengthening the foundation for future generations.

In Saharanpur, sustainable farming approaches such as nano-orchard and multi-layer vegetable cultivation introduced to optimize land productivity. Portable solar-powered water lifting pumps efficient irrigation reducing dependency on traditional water sources. The establishment of a bio-input resource center encourages farmers to shift towards natural fertilizers and pest control methods, minimizing reliance on chemical inputs. Bund plantations improve soil stability, ensuring long-term agricultural sustainability. Kitchen gardens are promoted, encouraging households to grow their own vegetables for nutrition security. Low tunnel methods for vegetable cultivation enhance crop arowth controlled providing environmental conditions, ensuring higher yields and quality produce. Enterprise development initiatives empower local entrepreneurs, fosterina economic opportunities beyond farming.

Mushroom production is introduced as a lucrative agribusiness, offering farmers an alternative revenue source. Capacity-building programs for WSHGs equip women with essential skills income-generating for activities. Animal health camps ensure livestock welfare and productivity. Educational improvements, like smart classrooms in government schools, enhance student learning experiences. Drinking water solutions improve public health, while setting up libraries and conducting wall paintings in schools make learning environments more engaging.

Mohla

The program is being implemented from October 2023, covering 15 villages in the district of Mohla. The project aims to improve rural livelihoods and infrastructure while directly benefiting 1,445 households through various integrated interventions.

Significant progress has been made across all planned activities. In the area of land and water management, 90 acres have been treated through CCT, SCT, and farm bunding. Two solar-based lift irrigation systems and one dug well have been renovated, while 30 sprinkler-based micro irrigation units have been installed. Under sustainable agriculture, 225 acres have been brought under the System of Millet Intensification, and 120 vermi composting units have been promoted.

Access to drinking water improved through the installation of 10 solar-powered supply units. Support for agriculture continues with the promotion of 120 units each of oil seeds and pulses, along with two nurseries. Vegetable cultivation & Livelihood enhancement activities including the establishment of a millet cluster facilitation development of millet-based centre. enterprises.





















CASE STUDIES

VERMI-COMPOSTING

In the small village of Mohla, 22 km from Manpur, Gopichand Bhuarya—a dedicated farmer—has become a champion of sustainable agriculture. Through the Comprehensive Rural Development Program, Gopichand received training in vermi-compost and vermi-wash production. Equipped with a vermi-bed unit, drums, and technical know-how, he converted 600 kg of dry cow dung into 385 kg of nutrient-rich vermi-compost in just 45–55 days.

By producing two full composting cycles, Gopichand generated over 755 kg of compost—enough to support his upcoming Kharif crop season—saving ₹8,000 that he would otherwise have spent on chemical fertilizers.

India generates over 350 million tonnes of agricultural waste annually. If even a fraction is converted into organic compost like Gopichand's, it could significantly reduce soil degradation, enhance productivity, and cut input costs for farmers.

Today, Gopichand not only farms sustainably but also mentors others in nearby villages, spreading awareness about the benefits of organic composting. His work is a powerful example of grassroots environmental stewardship transforming both land and livelihoods.





NURSERY PROMOTION

Mangatram Dhurwa, a 45-year-old marginal farmer from Devasur village, once depended solely on his 2-acre farm for an annual income of ₹20,000. Under the Holistic Rural Development Program (HRDP) by HDFC Bank, he was selected for the Nursery Promotion Activity—a move that transformed his life.

With support, Mangatram set up an 800 sq. ft. nursery, received high-quality seeds (tomato, brinjal, chili, cabbage, onion), growth regulators, seed trays, and comprehensive training. In just three months, he sold over 15,000 seedlings to farmers across 15 villages, earning ₹54,112.

This initiative didn't just increase his income—it empowered him to become a local agri-leader, driving the agricultural growth of neighboring communities. Mangatram's story is a shining example of how small interventions in rural livelihoods can yield large-scale, sustainable impact.

DIWAASA - II

When we encountered the challenge of asymmetrical performance within Self-Help Groups (SHGs) and community institutions such as SHG federations in the Umarban area of the Nimar region, we recognized an opportunity to make a meaningful contribution. In partnership with Ernst & Young Foundation, we initiated a program aimed at strengthening 1,200 women-led SHGs, thereby impacting the lives of 15,000 women. Our comprehensive efforts, which included capacity building, structural development, training, and promoting financial inclusion, were designed to enhance the structural, operational, and financial stability of these SHGs and community institutions. This, in turn, fostered holistic development and empowered women within the community.

Following the success of the initiative, Diwaasa Phase II was designed and implemented across 309 villages in the Dhar district, spanning the blocks of Umarban, Nalchha, and Tirla. strengthening 2,509 Self-Help Groups (SHGs), representing a strong community of 28,800+ women members.

Diwaasa Phase II continued to demonstrate impactful progress in empowering rural women through livelihood generation, health initiatives, and institutional strengthening. The collaboration between SHGs, community stakeholders, and partner organizations remains the backbone of this transformation. The project recorded notable achievements across key indicators, showing strong community engagement and adaptive implementation.

This multi-pronged initiative aimed to build sustainable livelihoods, improve agricultural practices, and promote health and entrepreneurship in rural Madhya Pradesh.









WOMEN EMPOWERMENT THROUGH FOCUSED MICRO-INTERVENTIONS

Ratanbai Solanki from Dilawara village in Dhar district, MP, has overcome poverty and serves as a role model for local self-help groups (SHGs). Despite facing similar challenges as many underprivileged women in rural India, she has become a successful entrepreneur and created

jobs for her SHG members.

Past Anecdotes

Ratanbai, before joining SHG, held a humble background. Her husband was the only bread earner in the family, engaged in the agriculture (a primary source of income). But it was not enough to cater the needs of family. They regularly availed loans from local moneylenders, who would charge high interest rates. There were many instances when the agricultural production plunged and they left with a meagre amount after paying to moneylenders. Ratanbai was engaged in household works for most of her life and never been the part of any formal/informal groups or meetings like the SHGs or Gramsabhas in the village.



The Change


Ratanbai's life transformed after joining the Shree Krishna Swayam Sahayata Samuh in Dilawara village. She used credits from the SHG to buy goats, then buffalos and a sewing machine, increasing her income and escaping debt. As a beneficiary of the EY Foundation-supported DIWAASA project by CARD, she received training in low-cost agriculture and livelihood enhancement, which helped her save money. Inspired, she established a Public Distribution System (PDS) shop, providing employment to poor women in her SHG. Ratanbai's annual income now exceeds 5 Lakhs, a significant achievement for her.

Breaking The Status Quo

Ratanbai is now a role model to the women in her community. She, along with her SHG, has started to attend every Gramsabha and putting forward the issues like Water, Electricity and Roads in their mohalla. The SHG also strives to avail the government entitlements for eligible members of their SHG as well as that of the Village Organisation and also advocates for availing all the necessary government benefits through schemes.









Land Identification & Planning

Planted 337,035 saplings across 283.33 hectares in 2022–2023 & 330,320 saplings over 218.89 hectares in 2023–2024.

Post-Plantation Measures

Implemented replantation, gap filling, and Assisted Natural Regeneration (ANR). Appointed chowkidars and community workers for protection and care.

Monitoring & Community

Monthly reviews and community meetings ensured consistent progress and participatory monitoring.



Integrated Community Development Project

Pakyong, Sikkim Pithampur, Indore (M.P.)





Over the past year, Cipla Foundation in collaboration with CARD supported 20 Anganwadi & Resource Centres across 10 villages, impacting over 22,000 people. Key highlights of the work done are as follows:

Health & Nutrition

- Conducted awareness sessions on maternal and child health, reaching over 600 Anganwadi beneficiaries including pregnant and lactating women, and adolescent girls.
- Nutrition sessions led to improved hemoglobin levels among pregnant women.
- Distribution of Iron, Folic Acid, IFA, Calcium, Albendazole, and THR boosted health outcomes.
- FEC materials like pamphlets and health cards helped track health status for 90% of children and pregnant women.

Early Childhood Development

- Learning environments in Anganwadis were enhanced through TLM (Teaching-Learning Materials) and wall painting activities, boosting reading and creative engagement among children.
- Day care services improved the mental and physical development of children while easing the childcare burden for working parents.

Education & School Re-engagement

- 100% of identified dropout girls were re-enrolled into school, supported with regular counseling and follow-ups.
- District and block-level workshops helped align school and community stakeholders in addressing dropout challenges.

Livelihood & Women Empowerment

- Skill training in beauty therapy and tailoring empowered 100 women and adolescent girls, with 50% earning over ₹3000/month and several initiating their own businesses.
- Adolescent girls also received life skill and hygiene training, equipping them with knowledge on self-defense, nutrition, emergency preparedness, and health.

Community Development

- Kitchen gardens were established in 8 centres, enabling families to grow and consume nutritious food regularly.
- Infrastructure support (furniture and seating) transformed 3 Anganwadis into child-friendly learning spaces.

Capacity Building

- Anganwadi workers and health workers received training on key health, nutrition, and management practices.
- Enhanced knowledge resulted in implementation of improved health protocols at the grassroots level.



Nutrition and Motherhood



Jayanti, a young pregnant woman from Jeevan Jyoti Colony, was diagnosed with anemia—her hemoglobin level had dropped to 10.5 grams. Tiredness, weakness, and uncertainty clouded what should have been a joyful journey to motherhood.

In rural India, women who do not receive timely nutritional care and antenatal support face serious long-term health consequences. Anemia often goes undiagnosed, leading to complications such as fatigue, increased risk of infections, premature births, and low birth weight in infants. Without awareness and intervention, both mother and child remain trapped in a cycle of poor health—affecting the child's physical and cognitive development and the mother's ability to recover post-delivery. Lack of access to such basic care continues to widen the health gap in underserved communities.



With from CARD's support Anganwadi outreach, Javanti joined a nutrition awareness session and received personalized counselling. She was guided on simple vet powerful dietary changes incorporating iron- and calciumrich foods into her meals.

Just weeks later, her hemoglobin improved to a healthy 11.5 grams. Today, Jayanti stands proud—healthier, stronger, and more informed. Her story is a glowing example of how timely care and community-based interventions can rewrite the future for both mothers and their children.



Eklavya's Journey to Strength



India is home to over one-third of the world's malnourished children, with 35.5% of children under five stunted due to chronic undernutrition (NFHS-5). Malnutrition not only stunts physical growth but also impairs brain development, learning ability, and immunity.

Eklavya, a 2.9-year-old boy, was found severely underweight during a home visit—his weight (9.9 kg) was below the healthy range for his height. His frail health was not just a number, but a reflection of the silent crisis affecting millions of children across rural India.

Thanks to the timely intervention by the CARD team and Anganwadi workers, Eklavya was enrolled in the local Nutrition Rehabilitation Centre. Through consistent follow-ups, medical care, and a focused nutrition plan, his weight increased to 11.1 kg—bringing him into the healthy range.

Eklavya's transformation is not just about physical recovery—it represents the powerful impact of grassroots health initiatives in giving every child a fair start at life.





CIPLA Foundation's Integrated Community Development Project in Sikkim reached over 1,033 direct beneficiaries and 673 indirect beneficiaries through a range of impactful health, nutrition, and community-based interventions. The project supported emergency care by procuring an ambulance for CHC Rhenock, enabling timely transport for 84 patients. Collaborating with the local health department, 141 community members engaged in health camps, leading to improved health outcomes and reduced out-of-pocket costs. Nutrition awareness sessions reached 78 women, enhancing their understanding of healthy diets and pregnancy care. Adolescent girls and pregnant women were also supported through awareness drives, increasing service participation. Workshops trained Anganwadi workers and local youth in nutrition, hygiene, and child development, fostering improved community care. Over 100 community members gained access to government entitlements like Ayushman Bharat and Atal Pension Yojana, while special vaccination campaigns covered 100% of pregnant women and children in target villages. Capacity building was further extended through the training of 20 Anganwadi workers and 24 adolescent girls. The program also ensured regular support for approximately 30 children at Anganwadi centers, and enhanced learning outcomes for over 1,000 students through a primary school and model school resource centers. Diagnostic services were bolstered by the installation of an X-Ray machine at CHC Rhenock, benefitting 380 patients. Overall, the project achieved strategic outcomes in enhanced accessibility, community empowerment, service capacity building, and sustainable healthcare infrastructure.

Strategic Outcomes Achieved

- Enhanced Accessibility: Increased healthcare and government scheme access across underserved populations.
- Capacity Development: Empowered frontline workers and service institutions with training and infrastructure.
- Sustainability Focus: Strengthened long-term systems including immunization drives, maternal health, and adolescent education.
- Community Empowerment: Amplified awareness and agency among women, adolescents, and the rural poor.







Hygiene a habit in Titribotey school



This story from Titribotey stands as a model for how small, consistent efforts in hygiene education can spark lasting behavioral change and support holistic adolescent development.

Titribotey Primary School, many adolescents lacked awareness about personal hygiene and basic life skills—an issue common in underserved rural schools across India. Recognizing this gap, CARD Sikkim launched ล focused Adolescent Training Program on life skills and health hygiene for 40 students.

The intervention included practical sessions on handwashing, brushing teeth, polishing shoes, and maintaining cleanliness. Essential hygiene kits were also distributed. With strong reinforcement by the school's headmistress, Smt. Kanta Lama, these practices became part of the daily school routine.

The impact was immediate and visible. Students began attending school more regularly and displayed improved personal hygiene—a proven factor in boosting confidence student and academic participation. According to UNICEF, poor hygiene is a key reason for absenteeism in schools, especially among adolescents. By instilling these habits early, the program not only improved health outcomes but also contributed to students' self-esteem and classroom engagement.



Environment Sustainability

(Pakyong, Sikkim)

Impact Snapshot

CIPLA Foundation's environmental sustainability program in Sikkim adopted a grassroots, eco-conscious approach, integrating sustainable farming, clean energy, and community education. The initiative not only enhanced environmental resilience but also supported livelihood diversification and child welfare.

Sustainability through Poultry farming





In the village of Amba in Pakyong District, Sikkim, Mr. Palzor Lepcha, a traditional farmer, struggled to explore poultry farming due to limited financial resources. Recognizing his interest and potential, the Centre for Advanced Research and Development (CARD) stepped in with targeted support—providing 100 chicks, five bags of feed, and essential supplies such as feeders, drinkers, and basic medicines. This intervention helped Mr. Lepcha set up his first poultry unit.


Within a short period, he earned a profit of ₹45,000 and expanded his venture by setting up a second unit. He now earns ₹20,000 every 45 days, ensuring a steady supplementary income for his family. His visible success sparked interest in his community, motivating at least ten others to pursue poultry farming. While Mr. Lepcha is the direct beneficiary, the program's impact has extended to many more, creating a ripple effect of livelihood opportunities in the region.

Comminity led Watershed Initiative Jal Samruddhi

A Mahindra and Mahindra initiative Facilitated by CARD in Shajapur & Agar Districts, Malwa Region, Madhya Pradesh







Target vs Achievement

- As part of the initiative to renovate water harvesting structures in the Shajapur and Agar districts, CARD successfully achieved or surpassed all major project targets for the year.
- A total of **11 ponds** were targeted for desiltation and repair, and **all 11 were completed**, meeting the 100% target. Similarly, **22 Water User Groups (WUGs)** were scheduled to be trained, and training was successfully completed for all 22 groups, involving **144 farmers**.
- To enhance women's participation, 8 training sessions each were planned on improved agriculture and livestock management. All agriculture training sessions were conducted, benefiting 223 women, while 9 livestock training sessions were conducted, exceeding the target and engaging 281 womenacross 11 villages.
- One **Jal Sammelan** was organized as planned, along with **display and branding activities** completed in all 11 villages.
- In terms of water outcomes, the project aimed to create a water storage potential of 59,026 cubic meters (CUM) and achieved 66,611 CUM, exceeding the target. Additionally, irrigation potential was created over 168 hectares against the planned 165 hectares.
- The project also surpassed its reach goals, with **1,100 households** benefiting (target: 1,065) and a total of **7,700 individuals** covered (target: 7,500).





Development & ntegrated



An initiative of Axis Bank Foundation - Chachaura, Guna District

Axis Bank Foundation has launched a comprehensive CSR initiative in the Chachoura block of Guna district aimed at fostering integrated development and livelihood transformation. The initiative spans across 46 Gram Panchayats and 124 villages, with a strong emphasis on empowering communities through the promotion of Self-Help Groups (SHGs).

A total of 1,500 SHGs have been identified, reaching out to 15,000 SHG beneficiaries and an additional 15,000 other beneficiaries, making a significant impact on household-level development.

The Promotion of Regenerative Agricultural Practices for a Food Secure and Climate Resilient Future is a pioneering initiative aimed at enhancing agricultural sustainability in the Mandla and Dindori districts of Madhya Pradesh.

This project focuses on promoting regenerative agriculture practices with an emphasis on oilseed crops such as Niger, Linseed, Mustard, and Sesame. By introducing environmentally friendly farming methods, the project aspires to address challenges related to food security, climate resilience, and farmers' livelihoods.

The first step of regenerative agriculture involves pilot implementation, capacity building, baseline assessment, and community mobilization. It includes teaching farmers, organizing farmer organizations, surveying current practices, and conducting seminars at the village level.

The second phase involves production of organic inputs, water resource management, and demonstration plots. The main goal is to integrate cover crops, mulching, composting, natural pest management, drought-tolerant crops, and native varieties. It intends to reduce dependence on chemical inputs while increasing yields, prices, and environmental benefits. Capacity building, organic input production, water resource management, and demonstration plots are all part of the program. Reducing dependence on chemical inputs involves teaching farmers about basic practices such as crop rotation, agroforestry, composting, and no-till farming. It also encourages the use of farm waste.

Approach & Phase-wise Focus:

Phase I:

- Pilot implementation, baseline assessments, capacity building
- Farmer mobilization through workshops and seminars
 Phase II:
- Organic input production, cover crops, mulching, pest management, and demonstration plots

CHILD DEVELOPMENT PROJECT

Funded By: Child Fund International Locations- Dhar & Jhabua districts (M.P.)



This initiative, focuses on the well-being and development of children, especially from marginalized communities, implementing holistic and sustainable themes to meet their needs. Key areas include health, nutrition, education, livelihood, gender equality, and child protection. The project aims to create a safe and empowering environment for children to thrive and break the cycle of intergenerational poverty.



The project focused on enhancing children's foundational literacy, numeracy, and emotional well-being through various initiatives:

PENCIL Centres: Engaged 2,912 children aged 3-12, promoting critical thinking and multilingual literacy via community involvement and school libraries.

Social Emotional Learning (SEL) sessions: Benefited 7,374 children in 31 schools, helping them manage emotions and make responsible decisions.

Smart Classes: Provided continuous education access to 870 students.

Additionally, 45 Parent Teacher Association (PTA) meetings with 1,864 participants and 48 School Management Committee (SMC) trainings for 1,492 members aimed to strengthen governance and communication.

The UDAAN initiative supported 59 girls with ₹15,000 each for tuition and materials, alongside career counseling to guide them in educational and career pathways. Staff capacity building was also emphasized to improve SEL implementation and support children's cognitive and emotional growth.



HEALTH

A series of health and nutrition interventions were implemented to improve the well-being of children, adolescents, and mothers in Madhya Pradesh. Key activities included Positive Deviance sessions across 18 villages promoting the use of local nutritious foods to combat child malnutrition, benefiting over 3,000 participants. Adolescent Peer Educator trainings were held in schools to raise awareness on health, hygiene, and mental wellbeing, empowering 3,249 students. Sexual and Reproductive Health sessions engaged adolescents and community members through interactive methods to discuss safe practices, hygiene, and emotional health. Additionally, districtlevel workshops with health officials were conducted to align grassroots health initiatives with government schemes. 148 frontline workers, including ASHAs and ANMs, received training on maternal and child health (RMNCAH), parenting, and early childhood care to strengthen service delivery at the community level.



LIVELIHOOD

The project has implemented a wide range of youth development activities aimed at enhancing life skills, employability, leadership, and community participation among youth across Jhabua, Tirla, Rama and Rajgarh blocks.

- 26 youth groups formed (390 youth)
- 1300 youth trained on social and financial literacy, emotional intelligence, confidence-building, problem-solving, and personal development. 78 sessions conducted on participation in local governance, advocacy, and project planning
- Under Community participation, youth are engaged in nursery establishment and integrated farming to support income generation with sustainable agriculture and food security
- 30 youth engaged in regular IT, soft skills, and career guidance training under the Livelihood EEE model
- Basic electrician course conducted with PMKVY certification, youth trained in electrical safety, circuits, tools, and job roles.



Government and CSR-backed skill development initiatives are addressing these challenges by equipping rural youth and women with market-relevant skills, creating pathways for employment and entrepreneurship.



SHAPING FUTURE THROUGH SKILL ENHANCEMENT

Amit Kanjorve, from Bhonda village in Mandla district, Madhya Pradesh, is part of a humble farming family. Despite completing his 12th and an ITI in Electrical, he struggled to find a career path until discovering the Suryamitra Skill Development Program in a newspaper, marking a turning point. Through rigorous training, Amit gained technical expertise, discipline, and self-confidence. His On-the-Job Training at Fine Vibes Service enhanced his practical knowledge. After assessment, Amit was placed with Navitas Solar Pvt. Ltd., Gujarat. Now, he thrives in a supportive environment, fulfilling his dream of financially supporting his family.

Amit's journey showcases skill development's power in transforming rural youth into self-reliant professionals. He remains grateful to the Suryamitra Program and CARD for lighting the way toward a brighter future.





Sharad Kumar Vishwakarma, a youth from Limarua village in Mandla district, Madhya Pradesh, transformed his life through technical education and skill development. After completing his schooling and an NCVT-certified electrician course from Government ITI Bichhiya, he started his own electrical shop. Aspiring to grow in the renewable energy sector, he joined the Suryamitra Skill Development Program through CARD Mandla.

The 600-hour residential training provided him with comprehensive skills in solar PV system installation, safety, and system design followed by a 15-day On-the-Job Training, gaining hands-on field experience.

Post-assessment, Sharad received multiple job offers and joined Navitas Solar Pvt. Ltd. in Gujarat as a Solar PV Technician with an annual CTC of ₹2.53 Lakhs

Ravi Nagpure, from Kosmi village near Balaghat, comes from a low-income family where his father runs a small pani-puri stall. Despite financial struggles, Ravi completed his undergraduate studies but was unable to pursue technical education. With a strong desire to support his family and continue learning, he joined the Front Office Associate training under the Ministry of Tourism at CARD Balaghat. After completing the training, he was placed at Hotel Grand Kamal with a monthly salary of ₹9,000.



EMPOWERING THE DE-NOTIFIED, NOMADIC AND SEMI-NOMADIC TRIBES (DNTS) -






The project, implemented across 5 districts in Madhya Pradesh, is designed to empower the Denotified and Nomadic Tribes (DNTs), through a holistic approach involving community mobilization, formation of Self-Help Groups, financial inclusion, and skill development. A target of **50 SHGs** per district is allocated, with the objective of forming functional SHGs that bring together beneficiaries from the DNT communities. These SHGs serve as a platform for collective savings, credit access, and mutual support. As part of the empowerment process, beneficiaries are assisted in registering on the DNT Portal to ensure their inclusion in welfare schemes and to establish their identity within institutional systems.

Financial inclusion is a key pillar of the project. Bank accounts are opened for SHG members to facilitate savings, direct benefit transfers, and access to formal financial services. Alongside this, structured community engagement activities are undertaken to understand their needs, resource mapping, and planning entry-point activities. These entry-point interventions—such as improvements in water access, sanitation, and community infrastructure—are intended to build trust and demonstrate tangible benefits to the DNT communities.

To build long-term resilience and enhance livelihoods, skill development training programmes will be organized for SHG members. These trainings will cover a wide range of livelihood and vocational areas including tailoring, livestock management, agro-processing, handicrafts, construction trades, digital literacy, and financial management.

The overarching goal of the project is to create sustainable community institutions, ensure access to government welfare schemes (PMJAY, PMAY (G/U), etc., build individual capacities, and enhance economic opportunities for DNTs through participatory and inclusive development practices.

Celebrating Breakthroughs,







Capacity building of ASHA workers is a continuous process. ASHA workers are constantly trained to acquire the necessary knowledge, skills and confidence to efficiently carry out their responsibilities at the community level.

At district level, CARD organization is responsible for providing facilities for training, proper accommodation and facilities for training, it is done by CARD organization in Ujjain.

In the year 2024-25, a target of total 84 trainings was given by Rashtriya Swasthya Mission Madhya Pradesh, which was 100% completed under the monitoring and coordination of the office of Chief Medical and Health Officer, District Ujjain. In which 39 trainings of urban ASHAs and 46 trainings of rural ASHAs have been done.

A total of 255 trainers provided training in the year 2024-25, in which 11 trainers from Ujjain district and 20 trainers from 9 other districts Agar, Panna, Vidisha, Bhopal, Jhabua, Dewas, Indore etc. gave

In 2024–25, a comprehensive, multi-module training programme was implemented to strengthen the capacity and knowledge base of ASHAs across critical health domains. These training sessions focused on enhancing technical competencies, improving maternal and child health outcomes, addressing gender-based violence, and promoting mental health awareness.

- Develop women-friendly designs, identify infrastructural gaps, if any and fulfill them in collaboration with the relevant departments
- Provide information and advisories about available resources and timely support services using technology
- Provide self-defense training to women and girls
- Promote women workforce participation in tourism sector through orientation and skill enhancement programs
- Provide job opportunities to women through employment and selfemployment at tourist destinations
- Encourage community participation and enable ownership and responsibility within the community for women's safety Formation of legal bodies and federations in order to organize local communities to ensure the safety of women

A first of its kind initiative by the Madhya Pradesh's Tourism Department, funded by the Nirbhaya Kosh, this project aims to create Safe Tourist Destinations for travelers, providing them an enabling environment to travel alone, by creating women friendly support system.



CARD has created a women workforce of 275 females as security guards, e-rickshaw drivers, nav-chalak, food and beverage associates, computer operators, petrol pump workers, city guides, retail sale executives, in hospitality sectors, and promoting local art and culture at Ujjain, Mandla, Dewas and Kanha





CASE STUDY: EMPOWERING WOMEN THROUGH MOBILITY – JOURNEY OF SEEMA, E-RICKSHAW DRIVER IN UJJAIN

Name: Seema Verma

Age: 32 years

Location: Ujjain, Madhya Pradesh Skill Training: E-Rickshaw Driving

Seema comes from a lower-income background. She is separated from her husband and lives alone in a rented house with her son.

In 2023, she came across the STDW-supported driving training program conducted by CARD in Ujjain. Despite initial hesitation and societal doubts, Seema enrolled in the 3-month e-rickshaw driving course tailored for women. The training included hands-on driving practice, traffic rules, basic vehicle maintenance, and soft skills such as customer interaction and safety.



Post-training, Seema rented an e-rickshaw from a local vendor. She started driving tourists and pilgrims to various temples across Ujjain, including Mahakaleshwar Temple, Ram Ghat, and Harsiddhi Temple. Her polite behavior, safe driving, and reliability soon earned her appreciation.

With consistent daily earnings, she began saving a portion of her income. Within nine months, Seema managed to purchase a second-hand e-rickshaw of her own. This ownership not only increased her profit margin, but also gave her a stronger sense of dignity and independence. She now receives regular bookings for temple darshan, especially from tourists who get her contact through word-of-mouth publicity. Many visitors prefer her for repeat rides due to her safe and respectful conduct.

Her monthly income averages ₹12000, enabling her to support her son's education independently. Seema has become a role model for other women in her community. She actively motivates others to step forward and embrace non-traditional livelihoods.

Seema's journey is a testament to how targeted skill development and gender-inclusive initiatives like STDW can bring about lasting economic and social empowerment. From being financially dependent to becoming a confident, self-employed entrepreneur, her story reflects the transforming potential of mobility in women's lives.



"Many women associated with the Safe Tourism Destinations for Women (STDW) project are experiencing significant benefits. Initially, they faced challenges in gaining societal acceptance, particularly within maledominated service sectors. However, over the three years of the project, there has been a notable shift in attitudes. This transformation has been largely driven by continuous workshops and engagement with key stakeholders. As a result, these women are now being acknowledged by local administrations for their valuable contributions to the tourism sector."




POST-HARVEST LOSSES IN ONION SUPPLY CHAIN IN MADHYA PRADESH

The study involved identifying critical loss points and regional disparities in onion post-harvest losses across five districts in Madhya Pradesh, using primary and secondary data. 450 farmer households distributed across 67 villages within 26 development blocks. Data was collected using structured surveys, focus group discussions, and interviews with various stakeholders, including farmers, laborers, wholesalers, and retailers. The research was conducted in different clusters: Cluster I included Dewas, Indore, and Ujjain; Cluster II focused on Sagar; and Cluster III centered around Rewa.






FINANCIAL REPORT
