**NOTE FROM THE GENERAL SECRETARY'S DESK**

*It was another year which brought many achievements and work satisfaction. We associated with new national and international partners. With WaterAid, we're working on Women+Water Alliance, to improve and sustain the health and well-being of women and also started partnership with ISC for extending these benefits to the communities associated with the apparel industry. With M.P. Tourism Development Corporation, CARD has been selected to develop Rural Homestays in selected villages for livelihood enhancement of rural communities through tourism development. We have also witnessed the expansion of existing partnership with HDFC bank CSR, HRDP at a new location, Yamunanagar in Haryana, and with Child Fund India, the initiative was extended at Jhabua. Under the Skill Development initiatives, CARD has been able to secure partnership with the prestigious HSBC Skills and Deen Dayal Upadhyay Gramin Kaushalya Yojana (DDUGKY). With Tata Institute of Social Sciences (TISS), CARD proposes a new venture in vocational degree course, Bachelors in Vocational Agriculture in Bhopal. All the Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Kendras (PMKK) centers performed satisfactorily, completing 83% enrolment target and 96% of the trainees cleared the assessment process. The Agri-Clinics & Agri-Business Centres (AC&ABC) initiative is successfully progressing and completed 20<sup>th</sup> batch, recording 60% success rate in entrepreneurship development. The only pending issue of securing loans from nationalized banks has now been resolved. This would now open the gates for subsidy for our trained candidates, which is one of the important components of this entrepreneurship scheme. In the Financial Year 2019-20, almost all our field implementation projects ran smoothly, with the exception that we mutually decided to end partnership with IDFC First Bank. Our own premises at Dhar is ready and we are hopeful regarding its future as training center.*

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## WOMEN + WATER ALLIANCE


### INTERVENTION AREAS

State- Madhya Pradesh    District- Dewas (312 Villages)    District- Dhar (740 Villages)

Women + Water Alliance is a program funded by USAID and GAP Inc with WaterAid India as a partner, and CARD as implementing agency. The goal of the five-year Women + Water Global Development Alliance is to improve and sustain the health and well-being of women and communities touched by the apparel industry. CARD started implementing the project in July 2019 in Dhar & Dewas. The primary objectives of the program are:

- ✚ **Ensuring Water Security**
- ✚ **Improving Water Quality**
- ✚ **Strengthening Piped Water Supply Scheme**

### INTERVENTIONS



### SIGNIFICANT ACHIEVEMENTS

- District level training of 80 Aanganwadis and all officials (20 in number) from PHED in Dewas.
- Block level training of farmers in Sonkatch block on rainwater harvesting and improved farming techniques.
- 197 roof water harvesting structures made. 120 in Dewas district and 77 such structures made in Dhar district; contour trench also constructed on 30 ha land at Dhar in Dharampuri block under Jal Shakti Abhiyaan.
- Organized rally in Badnawar block under Jal Shakti Abhiyaan.
- Demonstration on Bori Bandhan developed in Ghatgara GP of Badnawar block.
- Trainings to all PRIs on rainwater water harvesting in Dhar and Dewas identified blocks under Jal Shakti. Apart from that, PRI trainings were also organized in Dharampuri block in Dhar.

### Case Study I: Community's Need: Ensuring Safe Drinking Water

Manasa village, also a Gram Panchayat, is located in Sonkatch tehsil of Dewas district in Madhya Pradesh. It has a total population of about 1392 people with 312 HHs in the village. Water crisis has always been a concern in this village, since, during summers, the water sources dry up and the village suffers with access to drinking water.

Under Women + Water Alliance, Manasa village was selected for various activities related to water security and water safety. With much focus on water safety in this village, water quality of mapped sources was done. During mapping of sources, our mobilizers came across a dug well in the locality of Other Backward Classes that was catering to drinking water and other household requirements of over 50 HHs. The dug well was unprotected and was prone to contamination. The volunteers identified in conducting water quality test were also engaged in safe handling of water sources and conduct awareness rallies and campaigns amongst the villagers on getting their water tested time to time and in assessing the condition of water sources. The response received from the OBC community was in asking to make the dug well protected and safe from contamination. Open dug wells are prone to several contaminations, especially physical contamination. To avoid that and for its safe handling, the open dug wells are closed and protected from such contaminations.

Considering the important role local bodies play in the development of a village, the volunteer along with the community mobilizer from CARD contacted PRI, who in response covered the identified open dug well in the village through the funds available with them. Water Safety in the village was ensured by active response by the Panchayat Representative and ensured that community drinks water from protected sources.

### Case Study II: Narrowing Down Zero-Day

Manasa Gram Panchayat had not only responded over ensuring water safety, but has also contributed towards water security. There was a pond in village Manasa which was constructed over 15 years ago in the area near a hillock in the village.

Pond constructed was (l x b x h) 300 x 360 x 15 ft in dimensions. It was catering to the needs of the village in terms of providing water to the cattle for their drinking and bathing purpose. In these 15 years the condition of the pond had worsened and the percolation was blocked due to silt deposits at the bottom of the pond.

While conducting awareness activities in the village, the mobilizers came across the existing watershed structures in the village of which the condition of pond was assessed and a request was made to the Sarpanch to help reconstruct the structure.

The Panchayat Representative (Sarpanch), on learning that pond deepening and removing the silt deposits increases the percolation of water thereby increasing the ground water level, helped in providing assistance in pond deepening of the same pond through funds available at GP level. The pond deepened up to depth of 7 feet and silt close to 22000 tonne was removed from the bottom of the pond during the process.

### **Case Study III: Water Ambassadors: Paving way forward through conservation**

Choubara Jagir is one of the selected Gram Panchayats for our intensive intervention. Through Women + Water Alliance Program, the objective is to make the Gram Panchayat a model Panchayat that will serve as an example of water security and water safety in combating water crisis in the near future.

The efforts made an impact when the villagers realized that in order to save water, we have to ensure that enough water is conserved, for this it was quintessential to start with the existing structures, i.e., reconstructing the existing structures. There was a stop dam constructed about 20 years ago in the village near Jamli Road. For the last three years the gates of the dam were removed and were kept aside. Observing this, it was brought to light by the volunteers in the village, who searched and found the existing gates in the village and approached Sarpanch for further technical assistance from the PRI. Due to the absence of gates, water could not be collected that could be used by the villagers and helped in percolation. It was wasted without being stored. Gates help stopping the water by collecting it for usage by villagers and conserves the rain water for household chores, irrigation, etc.

The mobilizers along with the villagers gathered and asked the Sarpanch to fix the gates. After the various steps taken by the mobilizers and volunteers in the Panchayat, Sarpanch took this initiative on priority and helped in arranging for necessary resources for fixing these gates again. The gates fixed will now ensure that the stop dam serves its purpose by saving and collecting water for the village.

## SITUATIONAL ANALYSIS OF WATER, SANITATION, HYGIENE (WASH) & LIVELIHOOD STATUS

### INTERVENTION AREAS

State- Madhya Pradesh    District- Sehore    Blocks- Budhni    Villages- 14

CARD conducted a study on the Situational Analysis of Water, Sanitation, Hygiene (WASH) and Livelihood Status in Budhni Block of Sehore District to obtain information on Sources of Water, Water quality and availability status of Sanitation Services and Several Socio-economic aspects like health, livelihood and agriculture practices etc. A water campaign was also conducted in 10 of the selected villages.

### SURVEY OBJECTIVES

- Situational assessment of 14 villages to obtain information on sources of water, water quality and availability, status of sanitation services and several social-economic aspects like health, livelihood, agriculture practices etc.
- Identification of challenges and issue relating to water and sanitation services for women and documentation of their aspirations for better WASH services.
- Mapping out of various government schemes in areas of water conservation, water and sanitation, rural development and watershed management that are operational in the block. Generation of information on nodal agencies that are implementing the various schemes and status of projects in terms of funding, allocation and expenditure.
- Implementation of water literacy campaign across 14 sample villages to make people aware on water conservation, safe water handling sanitation and hygiene promotion

## IMPROVING WASH IN SCHOOLS

### INTERVENTION AREAS

State- Madhya Pradesh District- Mandla, Dindori, Singrauli Blocks- 19  
State- Chattisgarh District- Korba, Rajnandgaon, Kanker, Jagdalpur, Dantewada Blocks- 11

The fact that WASH is the subject of dedicated targets within the Sustainable Development Goal (SDG 6) is testament to its fundamental role in public health and therefore in the future of sustainable development.

School and childhood should go hand in hand, but many children in low-income communities with no access to WASH are unable to attend class because they are sick with a diarrhoeal disease or, particularly in the case of girls in rural areas, because they have to spend large parts of each day fetching water for their family.

For children who are in school, the situation may be no better than at home: globally, around a third of schools have no safe water supply or adequate sanitation, leaving children dehydrated and less able to concentrate, and forcing pupils to use inadequate latrines or go to the toilet outside in the school grounds. For adolescent girls, the presence of a safe water supply and clean, functioning, private toilet facilities can be the difference between dropping out and getting an education. Furthermore, hygiene education at school can begin a lifetime of better health for all children.

As citizens, parents, policymakers and government representatives, we all have a role in making sure that every child receives the benefits of WASH in Schools:

- *Clean water for drinking and washing.*
- *Dignity and safety through ample toilets and washstands, separated for girls and boys.*
- *Education for good hygiene.*
- *Healthy school environments through safe waste disposal.*

CARD has been actively involved in the UNICEF's WASH programs since 2010 with the latest implementing programs being:

- *Support WASH in Institutions (School, AWC) & Menstrual Hygiene Management in 5 Districts of Chhattisgarh (Aug '18 to Dec '19)*
- *Achieving sustainable and Equitable Access of WASH (Water, Sanitation & Hygiene) in Schools (Swachh Shala) of 3 Districts of Madhya Pradesh (Jun'19 to Jan '20)*

### Daily Group Handwashing

Fulfilling every child's right to water, sanitation and hygiene education remains a major challenge. WASH in Schools supports global efforts to make the vision a reality: A world where all children go to school and all schools provide a safe, healthy and comfortable environment where children grow, learn and thrive.

### Menstrual Hygiene Management

Strong cultural taboos around menstruation, which are present in many societies, coupled with a lack of MHM services in schools, results in many girls likely staying away from school

during menstruation. Providing female students and staff with practical information and private and safe facilities for MHM contributes to dignity and gender equality and may decrease absenteeism. The importance of MHM in schools is increasingly recognized, but many challenges remain. Guiding principles have been developed to assist local and national authorities to overcome these challenges by planning and implementing effective MHM programmes.

## PARIVARTAN- HOLISTIC RURAL DEVELOPMENT

### INTERVENTION AREAS

State- Punjab, Haryana & Maharashtra      Districts- 4      Villages- 34

CARD is involved in the implementation of HDFC Bank CSR supported Parivartan project since 2017. This project is being implemented in total 34 villages of Punjab (6615 HH), Maharashtra (7364 HH) and Haryana (3638 HH) States.

*Ensure the reach of villagers towards the improved basic services of health, education etc.*

*Introduce & convince the farmers towards adoption of responsible farming practices to increase the returns from Agriculture/Agro-Forestry and also to ensure clean & safe village environment*

*Promotion of better livelihood options among women, landless and other deprived of households*

It was observed that agriculture, horticulture and dairy are the main occupation sources of the identified project villages. The community of project area is mix of both large farmers and marginal/ landless. Though the farmers of the region are involved in agriculture and allied activities like Dairy/Goatry/Poultry, but are struggling with reducing crop productivity and quality of produce. Lack of marketing arrangement at village level is another issue affecting farmers' income. The landless community members have very limited livelihood options. Education, drinking water, road, drainage, electricity, hygiene, improper veterinary services are the main concern of these villages. Considering these, selection is done to offer further inputs to promote responsible farming practices, livelihood opportunities to the small farmers and landless community members (male

& female). Besides, poor-quality community infrastructure is another issue of these villages which was planned to addressed under the project.

## PROJECT COMPONENTS

### Natural Resource Management

- 96 demonstrations on organic cotton & wheat production & bio-fertilizer preparation
- 463 farmers participated in exposures
- 5000 horticulture plantation done (Mango, Chiku & Sweetlime); 5000 plantations done on filed bunds (Custard apple, Lemon & Moringa)
- 15 farm ponds constructed, 1 earthen dam, 4303 m field bunding, 1800 metre of Inlet channel, etc. benefitting 622 farmers.

### Skill Development & Livelihood Enhancement

- 240 kitchen gardens developed
- 15 poultry & 25 goatry units established
- 129 solar street lights installed
- 1 SHG supported for paapd making machine
- 26 FIGs formed in 13 project villages of Yamunanagar; 390 individuals linked with FIGs

## SUCCESS STORIES

### Intervention Type: Goat Rearing

Location: Yamunanagar, Haryana

Name of Beneficiary: Smt. Reena Devi

Smt. Reena Devi W/O Sh. Deshraj is from project village Khilanwala. Deshraj is a labourer and his family members were dependent on his meagre income. Under the CSR Parivartan project, goat rearing opportunity was given to the members of Women Self Help Group of the project villages. Reena Devi, being a member started selling goat milk and livestock. The income of her family increased through this initiative. Goat Rearing has empowered her. She's able to provide financial support to her family and also helped her gain confidence.



### Intervention Type: NADEP/ Vermicompost

Name of Beneficiary: Mr. Satpal Singh

Location: Abohar, Punjab

No. of direct and indirect beneficiaries: 30

Farmers of Northern India are infamous for intensive use of chemicals in agriculture. Satpal Singh, a small but proactive farmer from Wahaba village, has a land holding of 4 acres. He sought help from CARD in setting up vermicompost unit and started using the compost instead of chemicals. This reduced his input cost. He also motivated other farmers from his village to use vermicompost. 22 farmers adopted the improved methods with the support of CARD. He was also one of the beneficiaries, with cotton demonstration plot through organic methods where he used vermicompost, bio -power, yellow traps and decomposer as a means of organic implementation. This led to the production of 12 quintals of cotton per acre. Satpal sells around 10 quintals of vermicompost to other farmers. Satpal is also doing apiculture. Following CARD's suggestions, Satpal's average income increased by Rs 30000 in one composting cycle.



### Intervention Type: Poultry farm

Location: Nanded Maharashtra

Name of Beneficiary: Inderabai Ravsaheb Kasbe

Smt. Inderabai W/O Sh. Ravsaheb Kasbe (project village Dhanegaon) belongs to a landless daily wage labour family. Inderabai became a member of SHG formed under HRDP Program. During the meetings, she got motivation to start a small business and decided to set up a poultry unit. Through some financial and technical support under the program and a loan from SHG, Inderabai started the poultry unit with 200 chicks. Her family supported her with the cost of construction of shed, electricity bill and medicines. Through this venture, Inderabai makes an additional family income of around Rs 6000 per batch.



### Program Mission

### Program Objectives

- **Increased productivity of Agriculture by 15% /acre** and Increased income of Farmers by 15 - 20%/annum
- Number of students from **government school** (schools under the project) **pursuing higher education** (at each level)

### FOCUS AREA: WATER & SANITATION

- ✚ Constructed 4 Drinking Water Supply System along with laying of drinking water pipeline ensured the safe drinking water needs for around 982 HHs.
  - ✚ Constructed 2 Waste Water Ponds for ensuring the safe disposal of waste water covering 770 HHs
  - ✚ Renovated 5 community toilets and construction of 210 individual toilets helped to improve the safe sanitation practices among 1,921 users
  - ✚ 3 Drainage Systems are established in Pune Rural which are providing clean and hygienic environment for 467 HHs
- Interventions have ensured access to safe drinking water and helped in reducing the water-borne & water washed diseases and drudgery on women.
  - 7 community habitations have become open defecation free (3 slums & 4 villages)
  - Community has become more aware regarding their health and hygiene
  - Panchayat has taken the responsibility of Operation & Maintenance of the established structures.

### FOCUS AREA: IMPARTING KNOWLEDGE AMONG FARMERS, AGRICULTURE WATER MANAGEMENT, HORTICULTURE AND ALLIED INTERVENTIONS

- ✚ Through demonstrations, input supply, training & exposures, kisan sammelan /mela, knowledge has been imparted to 6,365 farmers.
- ✚ Construction/renovation of 8 stop dams & deepening and renovation of 3 ponds has helped in increasing 100 acres of land under irrigation benefitting 475 farmers
- ✚ Support has been extended to 1,710 farmers for low cost high performing agriculture equipment
- ✚ Agriculture Resource Centre has been established in Pune Rural



- ✚ 2 Farmer Producer Organizations has been formed in Dewas & Pune Rural
- ✚ 181 Farmers are encouraged & supported to take up Horticulture farming including Kitchen Gardening & Orchard Development. Intervention covered around 40 acres of land.
- ✚ For increasing the family supplementary Income, 261 families are supported for backyard poultry and goat rearing which enhanced their income by 7,000 to 10,000 INR per annum
- ✚ Through 65 Animal Health Camps 16,448 cattle received services like vaccination, AI, general treatment, deworming, and de-ticking etc. whereas 743 artificial inseminations are facilitated. Around 6,000 farmers benefitted

## BUNDELKHAND INITIATIVE FOR WATER AGRICULTURE & LIVELIHOOD (BIWAL)

Reviving Bundelkhand's traditional tanks through community-led action to stabilise agricultural livelihoods in a region vulnerable to chronic water distress

BIWAL (Bundelkhand Initiative for Water Agriculture and Livelihood) is an attempt to revive Bundelkhand to its ancient glory by reviving the traditional water bodies and the surrounding ecosystem through community's engagement. At one point of being major source of water, these tanks over period have moved into disuse after centuries of neglect and apathy. A large number of these tanks are either silted, encroached upon or are being used for purposes other than water harvesting. It is the coming together of multiple civil action

organisations, water conservation experts, authorities and the community to bring back the culture of water harvesting and conservation. This consortium led by SRIJAN works on a large and comprehensive, economic and social development initiative, commencing with the first task of desilting the ponds and work ahead with a planned repair and restoration of the entire water harvesting structure, and its associated components, both on supply and demand side. CARD, one of the partners of the consortium has started the de-silting work with a target of reviving 10 such structures in phase I, providing indirect benefit to 2600 farmers from 65 villages.

## DIWAASA: WOMEN EMPOWERMENT THROUGH COLLECTIVE ACTION

### INTERVENTION AREAS

State- Madhya Pradesh    District- Dhar    Block- Umarban & Nalchha

Women Empowerment through Collective Action (DIWAASA) is a project supported by **Ernst & Young Foundation**, implemented by CARD in Umarban and Nalchha Blocks, Dhar, with collaborative support of SRLM. This initiative aims to strengthen women collectives through structural, functional and financial sustainability of Self-Help Groups (SHG). The SHGs formed are a grass-root level voluntary alliance wherein women belonging to same socio-economic strata of the society contribute a fixed amount for a particular time period until the group has enough capital to start its own lending process. These funds are then utilised for lending to other women to help and empower them through support, encouragement and financial assistance so as to allow them to achieve their personal and professional goals for a better future. They are linked with various livelihood activities for enhancing their income through azola, vermicompost, vegetable cultivation, dairy, poultry, goat rearing, small business/entrepreneurship, etc. Under this project target 1200 SHGs with 15000 members at Umarban block were identified with support of NRLM for the

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implementation of project activities.

### IMPACT BY CARD

CARD is changing the lives of women in rural areas by their capacity building and focussing on the importance of women as an institution. Through Diwaasa, we bring these women together to overcome their common problem and financially strengthen them by bringing in the habit of regular savings and inter loaning, enhancing their livelihood activities. Women are made confident and independent by enhancing their financial condition and be the forefront of the family as well as the society. The change in women SHG groups can be seen as they started following Panchsutra. Now, the women are able to run their SHG independently and have a voice in gram sabha and local institutions during society/village development discussions. They are linked with various livelihood activities for enhancing their income through Azola, Vermicomposting, Vegetable cultivation, Dairy, Poultry, goat rearing, small business/entrepreneurship, etc. The women are changing their life with the power of working in unity under SHG groups.

## SKILLING YOUTH

Skills and knowledge are the driving forces of economic growth and social development for any country. India currently faces a severe shortage of well-trained, skilled workers. A major gap exists between the educated and the skilled youth in our country. Those with formal education lack sector specific skills while those who are skilled have only basic education and lack the vision and don't make up to the standards of industrial demand. A bridge between this can be made through vocational courses. In an effort to scale up the skill training and push the economy forward, Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (MSDE) launched the Skill India program in 2015.



## ✚ NULM - PROJECT EMPLOYMENT THROUGH SKILL TRAINING & PLACEMENT (EST&P)

The National Skill Development Policy 2015 points to a requirement of 109.73 million additional skilled human resources across 24 key sectors by 2022.

The Employment through Skill Training & Placement (EST&P) Component under NULM is designed to provide skills to the unskilled urban poor as well as to upgrade their existing skills. The programme will provide for skill training of the urban poor to enable them setting up self-employment ventures and for salaried jobs in the private sector. The EST&P Programme intends to fill the gap between the demand and availability of local skills by providing skill training programmes as required by the market.


The broader objective of the Employment through Skills Training & Placement (EST&P) Programme is -

- To provide an asset to the urban poor in the form of skills for sustainable livelihood.
- To increase the income of urban poor through structured, market-oriented certified courses that can provide salaried employment and / or self-employment opportunities which will eventually lead to better living standards and alleviation of urban poverty on a sustainable basis.
- Ensure inclusive growth with increased contribution of skilled urban poor to the National Economy.

Skill development, under EST&P is defined as any domain-specific demand-led skill training activity leading to employment or any outcome oriented activity that enables a participant to acquire a Skill, duly assessed and certified by an NSQF-approved independent third-party agency, which enables him/her to get wage / self-employment leading to increased earnings, and/or improved working conditions, such as getting formal certification for hitherto informal skills, and/or moving from informal to formal sector jobs or pursue higher education/training .

Under the Skill development programmes, three types of training can be provided:

- Training of fresh entrants to the job market.
- Reskilling or skill up-gradation of persons already engaged in an occupation.
- Formal recognition and certification of persons who have acquired skills through informal, non-formal or experiential training in any vocational trade or craft, after imparting bridge course, if necessary.

including women, have fewer choices and opportunities to break out of the cycle of poverty. This calls for a more concerted effort by the government, civil society, the private sector and individuals. Providing access to education and livelihood, particularly for young people from disadvantaged backgrounds is a central focus of HSBC's corporate sustainability initiatives in the community.

HSBC Skills for Life is a pan - India programme that will support Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs) across three verticals:

- By providing employment and entrepreneurship-linked skills training to disadvantaged young people.
- Upskilling educators and teachers through 'Training of Trainers' (TOT) approach so that they deliver relevant and 'learner-focused' content to end beneficiaries.
- Enhancing capacities of rural and urban disadvantaged young women to improve their livelihood potential by imparting financial literacy and building entrepreneurial capabilities.

A target of 100 Domestic Data Entry Operator and 100 General Duty Assistant has been given to CARD- Ujjain for the year 2019-20.

#### **AGRI-CLINICS & AGRI-BUSINESS CENTRES SCHEME**

Agri-Clinics & Agri-Business Centres (AC&ABC) Scheme, a Ministry of Agriculture and farmers welfare, GoI, in association with NABARD was launched in 2003 for better methods of farming to each and every farmer across the country. Recently it was observed that the youth from agriculture background were being driven away from the farming sector towards private jobs in urban areas. The AC&ABC scheme is an effort to provide opportunity to the rural youth (Agriculture Higher Secondary/ Graduates/ Science Graduates & above) to utilize their inherent knowledge of farming and allied sectors by honing their skills in 45 days free training at Nodal Training Institutes (NTIs). Upon successful completion of training, a techno-economic viable Detailed Project Report (32 indicative areas) is prepared and submitted to Nationalized Banks for loan application (upto 20 lakhs) to start their Agri-ventures. MANAGE, Hyderabad is the facilitator of this scheme.

#### **SALIENT FEATURES OF THE SCHEME**

Handholding support for receiving loan & subsidy upto 1 year

1 cr loan amount for a group of 5 trained candidates with 1 management graduate

No collateral security upto 5 lakhs

Loan repayment period is 3 to 10 years

Subsidy rate is 36% (General/ OBC) and 44% (Women/ SC/ ST/ North eastern & Hill States)

Credit linked, composite & back-ended subsidy with 3 years lock in period

*CARD has completed 20 BATCHES of the programme with more than 500 candidates. 60% candidates have started their ventures and loans of 4 candidates got sanctioned so far.*

Apart from providing self-employment, this scheme directly benefits a minimum of 3 persons by getting them employment opportunities in the established agri-venture and indirectly benefits farmers of 3-4 villages who get extension service by agro-consultancy from the trained candidates.

Our trained candidates regularly participate in refresher training programs for established agri-preneur conducted by Govt. institutions in various states. We as the nodal training institute provide handholding support to the trained candidates for upto an year, and in some cases even after that.

## SUCCESS STORIES

**Mr. Ramprasad Garg, M. Sc (Ag), Jabalpur** is working as a consultant for JNKVV, Jabalpur for 3 years. He practices organic methods of farming and uses cow urine, neem, surti, garlic, etc. to prepare insecticides and for land, seed and plant treatment, for healthy crops and reduced chances of pest and diseases. He wanted the income of the farmers to increase by adopting organic farming as sustainable agriculture method and spread his words by providing consultancy services to farmers. Presently, 600 farmers have joined his cause by adopting organic farming and helps farmers from sowing to harvesting & marketing. He earns around 5 lakhs pa from consultancy services alone. He has created employment opportunities and is applying for a loan for setting up a processing unit.

Before joining the AC&ABC training **Prateek Tawri, B. Tech (Ag) from Pipariya** worked with private companies for 3 years. He soon realised that his true passion was becoming an agri-preneur. Post training completion, he set up a poly house on 1 acre of land. In 1<sup>st</sup> year, he cultivated tomatoes and capsicum and in 2<sup>nd</sup> year, he planted seedless cucumbers due to its higher demand in metro cities. With drip and sprinkler irrigation system, 70% less water was used. He used organic methods of farming using organic manure thereby increasing the quality and yield of produce. Insect outbreak was also reduced. He earns 5 lakh rupees annually from 1acre land. The 60 days training refined his entrepreneurial skills. Prateek provides advisory services to farmers like use of scientific farming techniques, to reduce water usage, input cost and increased profits by choosing quality and treated seeds.

**Aditi Barole, B. Sc (Ag) from Amarwada, Chhindwara** started her Agri-clinic centre (Agri-Input shop) in 2019 post completion of 45 days training at CARD, Bhopal. With the knowledge gained during the training on advances in farming sector, entrepreneurship development, marketing, customer relation building, etc. she started providing consultancy service to farmers in her district on issues like advanced technology used in cultivating agricultural crops, poly house, custom hiring, kitchen gardening and promotion of organic farming. She is providing extension service to more than 1000 farmers. The turnover of the agri-input shop is 1 crore rupees.

**Shiv Kumar Sanodiya** is from village Kanhad, Seoni District. The potential of custom hiring centre was great in his area as most farmers have large land holdings, and less dependency on mechanized farming techniques, mainly due to huge investments required for equipment. Post training completion, he applied for a bank loan to purchase a harvester, and received a loan of Rs 13 lakhs from State Bank of India under the scheme. Besides increasing production and productivity, he also created income and employment opportunities. He's earning 10 lakhs per annum from the agri-venture. His CHC is a boon to small and medium farmers.



## LINK WORKER SCHEME

### INTERVENTION AREAS

State- Madhya Pradesh District- Ujjain Blocks- 6

Under NACP-III, the Link Worker Scheme (LWS) was launched to saturate the reach of the HIV related services to the high-risk group, vulnerable population based in the rural areas. It has been Estimated on the base of HSS 2007, that 57 percent of the HIV positive persons in India were living in rural areas (2007). This reinforced the requirement of an intensive rural-based intervention for reaching the marginalized groups which remaining covered even after the expansion of urban based prevention programs.

In order to achieve the NACP-III goal of halting and reversing the epidemic, the Link Worker Scheme was formulated for the rural areas of 187 highly vulnerable districts of the country. This short-term scheme aims at capacitating the rural community and equipping them with HIV related knowledge to combat the epidemic. At present, the scheme is being implemented in 135 districts with support from GFATM, UNDP, UNICEF and USAID. A comparison of urban-rural data reveals that rural areas account for 59% of the total infection. According to the national HIV sentinel surveillance, 2006, HIV prevalence among antenatal clinic attendees were 0.6%, and there was no marked difference in the urban-rural prevalence rate. However, in many states, rural areas either have a higher HIV prevalence rate than their urban Counterparts' or at the very least are at par with the prevalence rate in urban areas. There is growing evidence that HIV is no longer restricted to urban areas.


*With the NACO Link Worker program, Centre for Advanced Research and Development, District -Ujjain (M.P.) with the support of MPSACS, Bhopal is Implementing Link workers scheme for enhancing AIDS Knowledge, Skills and services amongst High Risk Groups, Youth and Adults in the villages of District-Ujjain, from March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2013. Link workers scheme is aimed at reducing the vulnerability of the most at-risk adolescents, especially vulnerable adolescents and high-risk groups in the rural areas as well as mitigating the impact of HIV on those who are already living with the virus. \*2 Migrants and 1 Trucker have been found HIV positive and are linked with ART.*

## OBJECTIVES

- ✚ Create an enabling environment for PLHAs and their families by reducing stigma and discrimination through work with existing community structures/group, e.g. village health community, SHG.
- ✚ Reach out to HRGs and vulnerable young people in rural area with information knowledge and skills on STI/HIV prevention and risk reduction.
- ✚ Promote increased and consistent use of condoms to protect against STIs and unwanted pregnancy. Generate awareness and enhance utilization, care and support program
- ✚ Generate awareness and enhance utilization, care and support program and services (STI, ICTC, ART, DOT)
- ✚ Facilitate the delivery of youth friendly health and counselling service through existing public health services/service delivery points.
- ✚ Facilities the reintegration of HRGs into the community and work with families against trafficking of women and children.



## TARGETED INTERVENTION

### INTERVENTION AREAS

State- Madhya Pradesh District- Bhopal

The prevention of new infections in high risk groups is a major thrust in National AIDS Control Programme III. The most effective means of controlling the spread of HIV in India is through the implementation of Targeted Interventions (TIs) amongst persons most vulnerable to HIV/AIDS, such as female sex workers (FSWs), Migrants, Truckers, MSM and IDUs. CARD joined the cause with NACO and MPSACS as a TI for FSWs since 2013 with a target of 1000.

In 2019-20, High Risk Group (HRG) coverage increased to 120% of the target. Average 82 % visited clinic and of these, 2 % were diagnosed with STI and were treated. 83 % were tested for HIV and none tested positive. Syphilis testing was done on 83% of the target.

### HIGHLIGHTS OF 2019-20

HIV awareness program was organized in SOS village, linkages of welfare scheme were done by TI in the region. A survey for vocational training of HRGs was done. Community based testing facility (HCTS) started. Health Care Provider (HCP) sensitization workshops organized with the support of “Nirantar Program” along with starting a help desk for mobilization of Social protection schemes for HRGs.



### INTERVENTIONS

- ✚ The provision of behaviour change interventions to increase safe practices, testing and counselling, and adherence to treatment, and demand for other services;
- ✚ Promotion and provision of condoms to HRG to promote their use in every sexual encounter;
- ✚ Provision or referral for STI services including counselling at service provision centers to increase compliance of patients with treatment, risk reduction counselling with focus on partner referral and management


## MGNREGA-NRLM-CFT Convergence Project

### INTERVENTION AREAS

State- Madhya Pradesh District- Mandla, Dindori, Dhar, Ujjain & Chhindwara Blocks- 8

Government of Madhya Pradesh has identified 62 blocks for implementing MGNREGS with Cluster facilitation teams (CFT) approach. The purpose of placing CFTs is to make sure that overall implementation of MGNREGS improves with generating higher number of wage days, increased investment on livelihoods asset development, timely planning and on-field execution. A total of 13 CSOs have been shortlisted to implement the project starting October-November 2019. MP-SRLM is the nodal agency that works with MGNREGS, District Administration and CSOs for smooth implementation.



As a part of Farmer Producer Organization (FPO) promotion (NABARD initiative), CARD formed 8 Farmer Producer Companies in Malwa region and 2 in Mahakaushal region during 2016-19. Of these, 4 Farmer Producer companies are supported by NABARD and registered under Company Act 2013 in Ujjain and Dhar and 2 FPOs are registered under Madhya Pradesh Society Act. 2 FPOs are supported by SFAC in Dhar.

Amongst the FPOs formed by CARD, the Kalisindh FPO, Ujjain became a successful model for replication over the years. It received equity grant from SFAC and working capital loan from various financial organizations and deals with agri-input supplies.

In a DST sponsored project, **“Livelihood Promotion of Tribal Women Collectives Through Application of S&T in Production of Natural Vinegar Using Local Natural Resources”** CARD is preparing natural vinegars using Jamun, Mahua and Honey and is in the final stages of formulation. The members of Bal Ganga Farmer Producer Company are involved in the production, packaging and later in marketing of the vinegars.

### ✚ MAIKAL HILLS NATURAL PRODUCT (MHNP) COMPANY

The MHNP, Ghughari was registered in 2005 and has been doing small business activities ever since. Presently, the honey processed and packaged at our technology resource centre is sold through this company.
